PLAGIARISM

- "Academic dishonesty"
- Not a legal matter; handled by the University
- Failing to give credit to others for their ideas, i.e., passing others' work and/or ideas off as your own
- Failing to correct formatting (e.g., quote marks or block quote)
- Keywords = *CITATION, IDEAS*

COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT

- Legal matter Governed by "fair use" provisions of the US federal copyright law (http://www.copyright.gov/)
- Only the *expression* of ideas is protected; ideas themselves are not copyrightable
- Fail to obtain permission when using material beyond "fair use"
- Keywords = PERMISSION, EXPRESSION OF IDEAS
